source of emotional strength in the farm he tending the barn while alice works as a nurse in the local elementary school but their peaceful life is shattered one day when a neighbor s two year old daughter drowns in the goodwins pond while under alice s care tormented by the accident alice descends even further into darkness when she is accused of sexually abusing a student at the elementary school soon alice is arrested incarcerated and as good as convicted in the eyes of a suspicious community as a child alice designed her own map of the world to find her bearings now as an adult she must find her way again through a maze of lies doubt and ill will a vivid human drama of guilt and betrayal a map of the world chronicles the intricate geographies of the human heart and all its mysterious uncharted terrain the result is a piercing drama about family bonds and a disappearing rural american life
