christopher hitchens at his characteristically incisive best the times thomas paine is one of the greatest political advocates in history declaration of the rights of man first published in 1791 is the key to his reputation inspired by his outrage at edmund burke's attack on the uprising of the french people paine's text is a passionate defence of man's inalienable rights in rights of man paine argues against monarchy and outlines the elements of a successful republic including public education pensions and relief of the poor and unemployed all financed by income tax since its publication rights of man has been celebrated criticized maligned and suppressed but here the polemicist and commentator christopher hitchens

marvels at its forethought and revels in its contentiousness above all hitchens demonstrates how thomas paine s book forms the philosophical cornerstone of the first democratic republic whose revolution is the only example that still speaks to us the united states of america

the life and times of this iconic and enduring biblical book the book of job raises stark questions about the nature and meaning of innocent suffering and the relationship of the human to the divine yet it is also one of the bible s most obscure and paradoxical books one that defies interpretation even today mark larrimore provides a panoramic history of this remarkable book traversing centuries and traditions to examine how job s trials and his challenge to god have been used and understood in diverse contexts from commentary and liturgy to philosophy and art larrimore traces job s obscure origins and his reception and use in the midrash burial liturgies and folklore and by figures such as gregory the great maimonides john calvin immanuel kant william blake margarete susman and elie wiesel he chronicles the many ways the book of job s interpreters have linked it to other biblical texts to legends allegory and negative and positive theologies as well as to their own individual and collective experiences larrimore revives old questions and provides illuminating new contexts for contemporary ones was job a jew or a gentile was his story history or fable what is meant by the patience of job and does job exhibit it why does god speak yet not engage job s questions offering rare insights into this iconic and enduring book larrimore reveals how job has come to be viewed as the bible s answer to the problem of evil and the perennial question of why a god who supposedly loves justice permits bad things to happen to good people

g k chesterton is remembered as a brilliant creator of nonsense and satirical verse author of the father brown stories and the innovative novel the man who was thursday and yet today he is not counted among the major english novelists and poets however this major new

biography argues that chesterton should be seen as the successor of the great victorian prose writers carlyle arnold ruskin and above all newman chesterton s achievement as one of the great english literary critics has not hitherto been fully recognized perhaps because his best literary criticism is of prose rather than poetry ian ker remedies this neglect paying particular attention to chesterton s writings on the victorians especially dickens as a social and political thinker chesterton is contrasted here with contemporary intellectuals like bernard shaw and h g wells in his championing of democracy and the masses pre eminently a controversialist as revealed in his prolific journalistic output he became a formidable apologist for christianity and catholicism as well as a powerful satirist of anti catholicism this full length life of g k chesterton is the first comprehensive biography of both the man and the writer it draws on many unpublished letters and papers to evoke chesterton s joyful humour his humility and affinity to the common man and his love of the ordinary things of life

drawing on sources that have only emerged or become accessible in recent years this in depth biography establishes anew einstein s complexity folsing also tries to reconstruct the physicist s thoughts in the context of contemporary research

a founder of contemporary social science max weber was born in germany in 1864 at his



death 56 years later he was nationally known for his scholarly and political writings but it was the international reception of his oeuvre over the last forty years that has made him world famous the protestant ethic and the spirit of capitalism the economic ethics of the world religions and his magnum opus economy and society with its treatment of the relations of economics politics law and religion belong to the great achievements of 20th century social science the groundwork for the posthumous weber reception was laid by weber s widow marianne a well known feminist writer who followed up her edition of his collected works with one of the greatest biographies in a generation that produced many important accounts of itself although unavailable in english until a decade ago the importance of marianne weber s 1926 work had been widely understood sociologist robert a nisbet called it a moving and deeply felt biographical memoir historian gerhard masur cited the book as the foundation of all further inquiries into max weber s life and influence beginning with max s ancestry and early years marianne weber guides us through his life as student young lawyer scholar and political writer quoting liberally from his voluminous correspondence her account of his nervous breakdown after 1897 which curtailed his academic career but ultimately strengthened his creative energies provides deep insight into some of the personal tensions that troubled him to the end in addition to her perceptive personal and intellectual life before the first world war describing many scholars social reformers politicians and literary figures within and beyond the famous heidelberg circle of the webers the new introduction by guenther roth situates marianne weber s own role in the contemporary setting and discusses the current state of weber research and of the international weber reception

a compassionate wide ranging study terry eagleton the guardian despite 21st century fears of a modern epidemic of loneliness its history has been sorely neglected a biography of loneliness is the first history of its kind to be published in english offering a radically new interpretation of loneliness as an emotional language and experience using letters and diaries philosophical tracts political discussions and medical literature from the eighteenth century to the present historian of the emotions fay bound alberti argues that loneliness is not an ahistorical universal phenomenon it is in fact a modern emotion before 1800 its language did not exist as alberti shows the birth of loneliness is linked to the development of modernity the all encompassing ideology of the individual that has emerged in the mind and physical sciences in economic structures in philosophy and politics while it has a biography of its own loneliness impacts on people differently according to their gender ethnicity religion outlook and socio economic position it is alberti argues not a single state but an emotion cluster composed of a wide variety of responses that include fear anger resentment and sorrow in spite of this loneliness is not always negative and it is physical as well as psychological loneliness is a product of the body as much as the mind looking at informative case studies such as sylvia plath queen victoria and virginia woolf a biography of loneliness charts the emergence of loneliness as a modern emotional state from social media addiction to widowhood from homelessness to the oldest old from mall hauls to massages loneliness appears in all aspects of 21st century life yet we cannot address its meanings let alone formulate a cure without attention to its complex protean history

there are those who say and peter cook himself was among them that most of his humour was autobiographical others and peter cook himself was among them contend that this simply isn t the case the truth of course lies somewhere in the middle peter cook made president kennedy wait in line to see him and visited elizabeth taylor in her dressing room he befriended tramps and fundraised for cnd he was capable of extraordinary kindnesses

and occasional cruelties he helped define comedy and satire for a generation but ended his life a recluse harry thompson has produced the first ever comprehensive biography of this influential and fascinating subject who came up with some of the funniest sketches and greatest jokes of all time

how the book of common prayer became one of the most influential works in the english language while many of us are familiar with such famous words as dearly beloved we are gathered together here or ashes to ashes dust to dust we may not know that they originated with the book of common prayer which first appeared in 1549 like the words of the king james bible and shakespeare the language of this prayer book has saturated

english culture and letters here alan jacobson tells its story jacobson shows how the book of common prayer from its beginnings as a means of social and political control in the england of henry viii to its worldwide presence today became a venerable work whose cadences express the heart of religious life for many the book's chief maker thomas cranmer archbishop of canterbury created it as the authoritative manual of christian worship throughout england but as jacobson recounts the book has had a variable and dramatic career in the complicated history of english church politics and has been the focus of celebrations protests and even jail terms as time passed new forms of the book were made to suit the many english speaking nations first in scotland then in the new united states and eventually wherever the british empire extended its arm over time cranmer's book was adapted for different preferences and purposes jacobson vividly demonstrates how one book became many and how it has shaped the devotional lives of men and women across the globe

this book explores the changing nature of power and identity from the iron age to the roman period in britain it provides fresh insights into the origins and nature of one of the lesser known but perhaps most significant late iron age oppida in britain bagendon in gloucestershire

why another book about vaccines there are already a few extremely well written medical textbooks that provide comprehensive state of the art technical reviews regarding vaccine science additionally in the past decade alone a number of engrossing provocative books have been published on various related issues ranging from vaccines against specific diseases to vaccine safety and policy yet there remains a significant gap in the literature the history of vaccines vaccines a biography seeks to fill a void in the extant literature by focusing on the history of vaccines and in so doing recounts the social cultural and

scientific history of vaccines it places them within their natural historical context the book traces the lineage the biography of individual vaccines originating with deeply rooted medical problems and evolving to an eventual conclusion nonetheless these are not biographies in the traditional sense they do not trace an individual's growth and development instead they follow an idea as it is conceived and developed through the contributions of many these are epic stories of discovery of risk takers of individuals advancing medical science in the words of the famous physical scientist isaac newton by standing on the shoulders of giants one grant reviewer described the book's concept as triumphalist although meant as an indictment this is only partially inaccurate

the cofounder of microsoft bill gates helped transform society by ushering in the era of ubiquitous personal computing this book examines the life and achievements of this standout american inventor and philanthropist bill gates has been instrumental in creating and developing the home computing era that has thoroughly transformed nearly every aspect of our lives from work to commerce to communication stepping down as ceo of microsoft in 2000 after 25 years at the helm he remained as chairman a position he still holds this book paints a vivid picture of bill gates that covers his early life and his years as an inquisitive and adventurous student to his experiences as a budding entrepreneur and billionaire philanthropist who has often been listed among the richest individuals in the world author michael becraft presents complete information on how microsoft evolved from the company's inception until gates's departure from active leadership documents the economic ethical financial legal management and leadership applications inherent in gates's work and examines the criticism that gates's actions and decisions have drawn throughout his career

joseph goebbels was one of adolf hitler's most loyal acolytes but how did this club footed
